



Alzheimer's Research needs aMCI Volunteers

Have you or a loved one been diagnosed with amnesic Mild Cognitive Impairment (aMCI)? We are conducting a one-month study to examine whether stimulation can modify brain networks to improve memory.

You may qualify if you

- Have been diagnosed with amnesic Mild Cognitive Impairment (aMCI)
- Are 50+ years old
- Are a native English speaker
- Have no history of severe head injuries, psychiatric illness, epileptic insult or dementia unrelated to Alzheimer's Disease

Participation involves

- 3 visits over the course of 28 days to our lab
- A word-recall task whilst receiving stimulation, EEG before and after, and a series of mood questionnaires.

Participants will be compensated €10 for travel upon completion.

Benefits of participating

- Contribute to cutting edge research investigating memory
- These methods are non-invasive, non-pharmacological, safe and with few adverse side effects. This non-invasive technique has been applied to healthy younger (18-35 years old) and older (65+) adults with positive results.
